The 5th Sunday of Easter

As we gather to worship, we commune with the Living God, who we believe is with us by His Spirit. We are active in worship through our songs, prayers, and gifts to God. We receive from Him through His Word read and preached and our reception of His Body and Blood.

And although we are unworthy, because of our many sins, to offer to you any sacrifice, yet we ask you to

accept this duty and service we owe, not weighing our merits, but pardoning our offenses, through Jesus Christ our Lord.
